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
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Sample Lesson Plan

Please remember all kids are different and during this fun early childhood stage it is still about having fun while learning. This is just a sample idea, please adjust to fit your child, and your family.






Sorting Chameleons












- I. Color the chameleon in the heart pink.

Literacy Connection ~ Sequencing

Pocket Chart printables can be used in a pocket chart or just simply laid on the floor or table. Print pages on cardstock, laminate and then cut apart into strips.

Story sequencing is an important skill in the early years and greatly helps with comprehension. Use these to work on putting the story back in order and also to work on reading with expression!







How did the chameleon look when he was on the tiger?


What did the chameleon want more than anything?






