- Practice writing the animal names




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Literacy Connection ~ Sequencing

Use the book along with the strips to put the story back in order!


Story sequencing is an important skill in the early years and greatly helps with comprehension. Use these to work on putting the story back in order and also to work on reading with expression!


More Ideas:

What happened at the end of the story?



Character Connection

In the book we see many pond animals. What if these were kids wanting to do something at the same time? They would need to take turns, right? Gather some stuffed animals {pond animals if possible} and practice having the animals take turns as you discuss how to be a good friend by being patient and taking turns when more than one friend wants to have or do something.

Use the phrases below to take turns drawing to decide who role plays going first and who role plays waiting.

While role playing, discuss based on the needs of your child and her/his struggles with friends. Role play situations your child would find him/herself in.
